## INTERNATIONAL LIBRARY BENCHMARKING IN TAIWAN: “EXPLORING LIBRARY POSSIBILITIES”

We were received in the briefing room of the National Central Library of Taiwan at 10 in the morning of October 20, 2016; Director-General Tseng Shu-hsien gave her welcome remarks while PAARL's President Michelle Esteban delivered her “Ms. Universe” remarks of peace and cooperation. Before the end of the program and before the start of the Library Tour, we had the publications and souvenir giving and group photos.

Two presentations were made: a) International Cooperation of NCL and b) Reader Services; notable are the (NDLTD) the National Digital Library of Thesis and Dissertation allowing open access to their collection of theses and dissertations; c) Taiwan Memory Collections which is composed of historical works coming from the Song, Yuan, Ming and Qing dynasties; c) the Digital Audio Visual Archive System and E-reading booth.

The National Central Library is found on the Zhongshan South Road which was completed in 186; with nine floors, 40,000 square meters of space; creating convenience to its

patrons and providing several-specific reading rooms, such as: New Chinese Books Reading Room; Theses and Dissertation Room, Reference Room, Periodicals Room, Rare Books Room, Microform Room, Government Information and Law Reading Room, Japanese and Korean Room, the Center for Chinese Studies Materials Room, and the Matteo Ricci & Pacific Studies Reading Room. All rooms' practices open shelves with internet resource search areas, copying and printing services.

The National Taiwan University Library (NTUL) was established in March of 1928, but the present main library was officially opened to the public November 1998. The notable acquisitions are the NTU Celebrity Manuscripts these are the published works of NTU scholars and alumni. Another is the NTU Collected Works which started in March 2006 maintaining the archived publications of authors associated with NTU. Lastly “Taiwan's Indigenous Peoples Resource Center” is a project commissioned by the Council of Indigenous Peoples of the Executive Yuan, this is located on the ground floor of the Main Library's north plaza. The reading areas of the basement are open 24 hours every day.

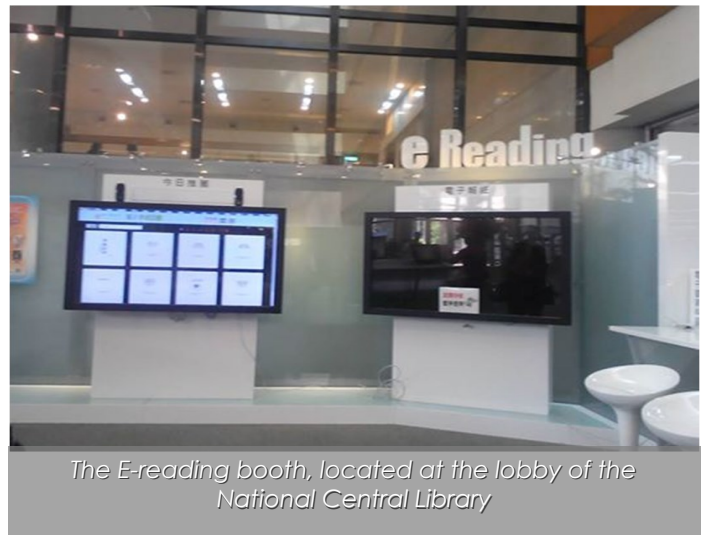

## PAARL Benchmarkers Beitou Library Tour

The Beitou Library is located within the wooded Beitou Park which is a rich natural environment. It is also considered as a “Green Building Library”; following the international trend of eco-friendly architecture, the library was designed to blend into its natural setting.

The building is comprised of three levels: two levels are for reading; while the bottom level contains the conference room and the children's reading area. The southern façade of the building faces the park, and the northern side looks out onto a stream. Large windows are placed on the three sides of the library to allow natural light to enter the library but at the same time giving a scenic and beautiful view of the tree-filled landscape; giving a feeling of “sitting in the middle of the forest as you read”.

The Beitou library achieved the nine indicators of a green building: biodiversity, greenery, soil water content, daily energy saving, CO<sub>2</sub> Emission Reduction, Water reduction, Indoor environment, Water resource and sewage and garbage environment.

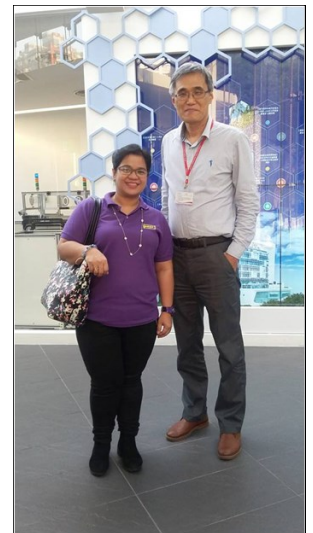

The New Taipei City Library was completed in October 5, 2015; and timely they were celebrating their first year when PAARL visited them in October 22, 2016; that is why the PAARL group received souvenirs from the Director; we were given a paper bag full of souvenir items. The New Taipei City Library is located on the Guixing Road of the Banqiao District, New Taipei City.

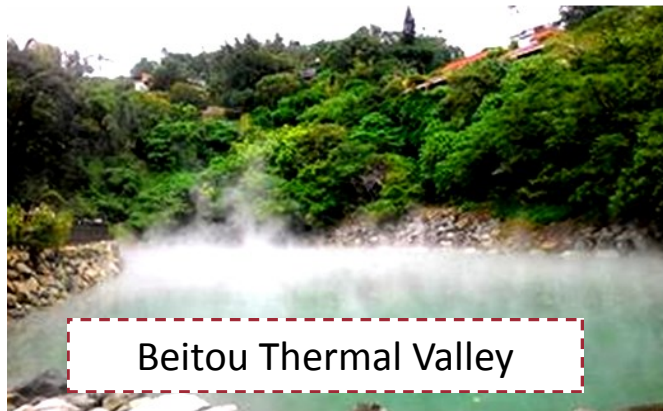
The New Taipei City Library has the theme banner: “A Home for you to read”; “is designed as a big shelf with lots of books stacking together” providing traditional library services and new technologies at the same time. Our group was able to see the diverse reading spaces provided by the library accommodating the needs of its diverse readers, allowing every patron to read in a friendly and comfortable environment.

The NTCL has the following unique services: a) the study room at the 4<sup>th</sup> floor and the self check out system are open 24 hours; b) the 5<sup>th</sup> floor to the 8<sup>th</sup> floor has reading corners decorated with specific themes, such as Japanese Zen style, Bali style, Northern European style, Mediterranean style; English style, South French Cottage style, American style c) pioneered in universal design and reader friendly, allowing disabled readers, senior citizens and readers with special needs to comfortable and convenient reading environment; d) the 24 hour self-check out system is the First in Asia; wherein a borrower can reserve a book and pick up the book on a self-checkout counter; e) the library also provide 1,100 kinds of periodical in different languages; f) the library was also constructed based on the 9 indicators of green buildings, the library is an environmentally efficient build-

Originally called the Beitou Public Baths, this was built in 1913; it was the largest hot-spring public bath. Today it showcases hot-spring-related historical gems of Beitou such as the Hokutolite or “Beitou stone”.

This museum showcases also Roman-style arches and columns on the first floor; common bath areas, Japanese-style interior and tatami mats on the second floor creating their own distinctive allure.

#### Taipei 101 Observatory

Taipei 101 holds the following features: having a total height of 508 meters; is a land mark, super tall skyscraper in Xinyi District; having the fastest elevator which reaches a top speed of 1,010 m/min., this would mean that one could go from the 5<sup>th</sup> floor to the 87<sup>th</sup> floor in 49 to 53 seconds.

In 2004 was accredited by the Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat (CTBUH) as the “World’s tallest building at 508 meters”, “World’s tallest floor in use at 438 meters”, “World’s tallest roof at 448 meters”.

We visited the 88<sup>th</sup> floor which is the Multimedia gallery and super big wind damper. The wind damper is the key feature that keeps TAIPEI 101 secure and safe. On the 89<sup>th</sup> floor is the indoor observatory giving a 360 view of Taipei’s skyline from every direction; while on the 91<sup>st</sup> floor which is on the top of the skyscraper allowed the participants to experience the panoramic view of the Xinyi District.

Tamsui Old Street and Fisherman’s Wharf

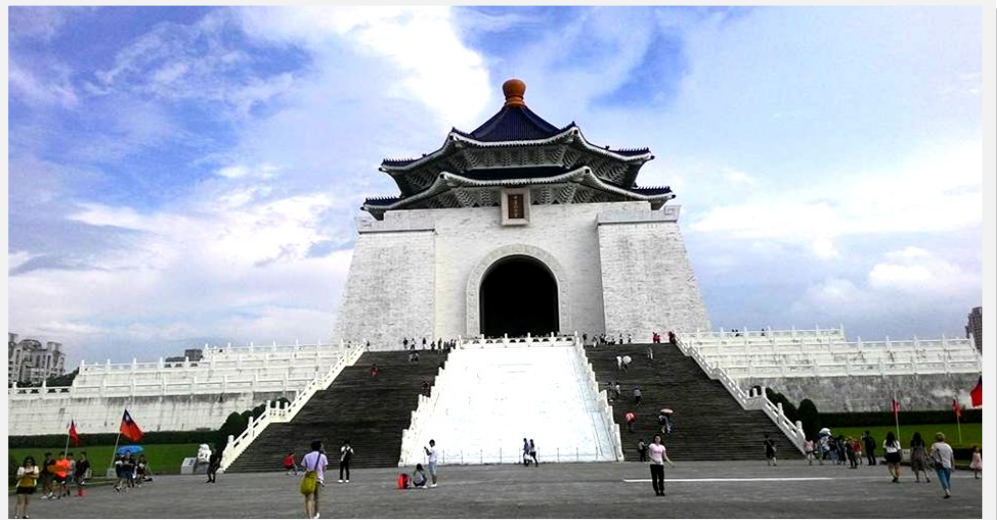
Tamsui Fisherman's Wharf is a very scenic spot at the western tip of Tamsui District, New Taipei City, Taiwan. Its predecessor was the “Tamsui Second Fishing Port” on the right bank of the Tamsui River estuary, an important fishing harbor in the early history of north Taiwan. The Tamsui Fisherman's Wharf is well known by its beautiful sunset and fresh seafood. While having sightseeing on the Lover's bridge and leisure facilities, it still holds its functionality as a harbor for fishing boats.

#### Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall

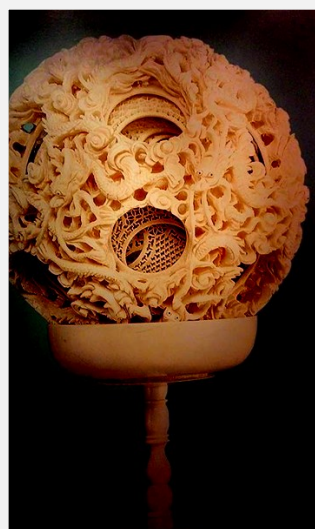
The National Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall is a national monument, landmark and tourist attraction erected in memory of Chiang Kai-shek, former President of the Republic of China. It is located in Zhongzheng District, Taipei, Taiwan. The monument, surrounded by a park, stands at the east end of Liberty Square. The structure is framed on the north and south by the National Theater and National Concert Hall.

The Memorial Hall is white with four sides. The roof is blue and octagonal, a shape that picks up the symbolism of the number eight, a number traditionally associated in Asia with abundance and good fortune. Two sets of white stairs, each with 89 steps to represent Chiang's age at the time of his death, lead to the main entrance. The ground level of the memorial houses a library and museum documenting Chiang Kai-shek's life and career and exhibits related to Republic of China-era Chinese history, and Taiwan's history and development. The upper level contains the main hall, in which a large statue of Chiang Kai-shek is located, and where a guard mounting ceremony takes place in regular intervals.

#### National Palace Museum

Our tour of the National Palace Museum started on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the Exhibition area at the audio guide counter for our audio guided tour of the museum. We saw great, wonderful and historical treasures of Taiwan such as the “Jadete” cabbage of the Qing Dynasty; glass red-overlay vase of the Qianlong reign of the Qing dynasty. We also saw the Mao Gong Ding cauldron that showed the origin and development of the Chinese characters. Another fascinating ancient masterpiece of exquisite craftsmanship was the carved openwork concentric ivory balls with cloud-and-dragon decoration (above pictured) from the Qing dynasty. On exhibit at the museum also were other splendors of the Qing dynasty such as furniture and religious sculptural arts.

#### National Revolutionary Martyr's Shrine

The National Revolutionary Martyrs' Shrine is a shrine in Zhongshan District, Taipei, Taiwan, dedicated to the war dead of the Republic of China.

Built on Chingshan Mountain and overseeing the Keelung River in Taipei's Zhongshan District in 1969, the Martyrs Shrine recalls the architecture of the Hall of Supreme Harmony in Beijing's Forbidden City. The structure houses the spirit tablets of about 390,000 persons killed, during the Xinhai Revolution, Northern Expedition, Second Sino-Japanese War, Chinese Civil War, and the First and Second Taiwan Strait Crises. A changing of the honor guard from the various branches of the Republic of China Military, similar to the rituals at the Sun Yat-sen Memorial Hall and Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall, take place at the shrine.

The Martyrs' Shrine was the site of the funeral of Chiang Ching-kuo in 1988. On March 29: Youth Day, commemorating the Huanghuagang Uprising and September 3: Armed Forces Day of every year the President of the Republic of China leads the heads of the five branches of the government to pay their respects to the martyrs by bowing and offering incense. Similar shrines are located in each locality in Taiwan, and similar ceremonies are led by county magistrates and city mayors.

### The Original Din Tai Fung

Din Tai Fung is a restaurant originating in Taiwan, specializing in Xiao Long Bao (steamed dumplings). Outside its native Taiwan, Din Tai Fung also has branches in Australia, Mainland China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Macau, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, South Korea, the United States, Thailand and Dubai. Din Tai Fung is known internationally for its Xiao Long Bao.

Founder Yang Bingyi was born in Shanxi, China, but moved to Taiwan in 1948 as a result of the Chinese Civil War. After working 10 years at Heng Tai Fung a cooking oil retailer, he found himself unemployed when the store closed. Together with his wife, Lai Penmei, they founded Din Tai Fung (also a cooking oil retailer) in 1958. The name was a combination of his previous employer's company name "Heng Tai Fung" and his new supplier's company name "DinMei Oils". Around 1980, tinned cooking oil became prevalent, and business diminished drastically. In order to survive, Yang and his wife turned over half the shop to making and selling steamed buns (Xiao Long Bao). The buns were so popular that the store stopped selling oil altogether and became a full-fledged restaurant in the 1980s. The original restaurant is located on Xinyi Road in Taipei.

Din Tai Fung was named one of the top ten restaurants in the world by the "New York Times" on January 17, 1993. In November 2009, the restaurant's first Hong Kong branch at Tsim Sha Tsui, Silvercord Branch, was awarded one Michelin star by the Hong Kong and Macau 2010 edition of the Michelin Guide. In December 2010, the restaurant's second branch in Hong Kong at Causeway Bay, Yee Wo Branch, was also awarded one Michelin star.

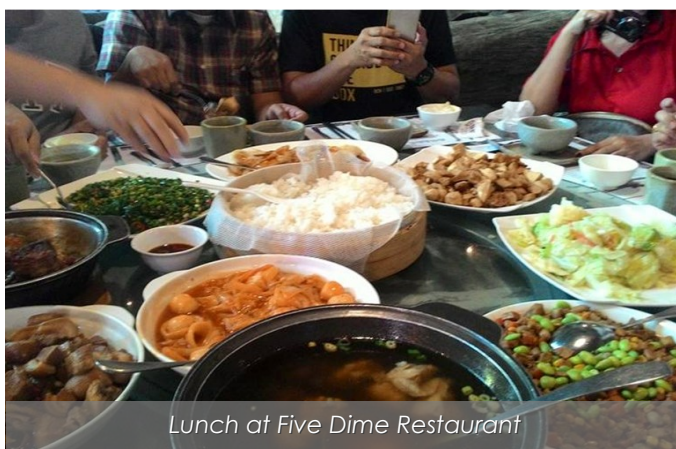

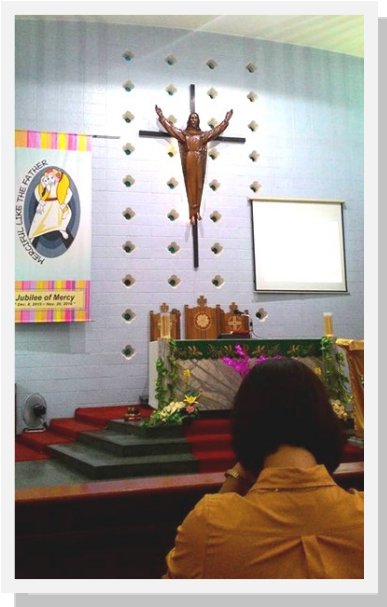
